I would like you to have a look back on your storyboard and see whether you have met the criteria described in the success criteria above. These are the main things your storyboard should include for it to be effective. If you have achieved all of these things, it would also be good to ask an adult in your house to have a look through your storyboard and they may give you suggestions of how to improve your work.
