Learning Objective To write a setting description based on your story board.

I would like you to have in front of you, the example setting descriptions you used yesterday, and the story board you created for your own story. Using the techniques, you saw in yesterday's examples, you will set the scene for one of the scenes in your story. This could be an opening scene, midway through your story, or your ending.

Depending on what your setting is, will change the type of vocabulary you may use. For example, if your setting was somewhere similar to a Disney Castle, you would likely use vocabulary such as 'magical, colourful, amazing, explosions of sparkle'. You would write about smelling the smell of food cooking, and candy floss and donuts coming from stalls. The sound of fireworks exploding, children laughing and enjoying themselves. Tasting the delicious cakes bought from the shops and being able to feel the warm air on your skin.

The opposite to that, would be a scary scene. You may use vocabulary such as 'frightening, horrifying, creepy, dark, dingy, foggy'. You could write about the smell of musky and damp mud and grass. Being able to see the misty and foggy night sky. Hearing the sounds of wild animals, or footsteps of a stranger, or even hearing your own heartbeat because of the deathly silence. Being able to taste the damp air as you run through a terrifying forest and feeling your cold wet clothes sticking to your skin.
