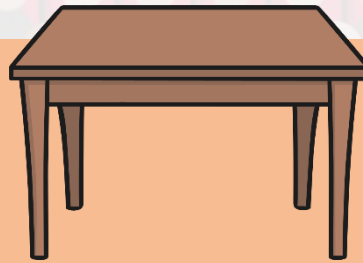

Stressed /er/ Spelt 'ur'

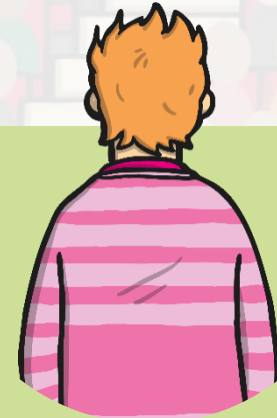


Can you air write an

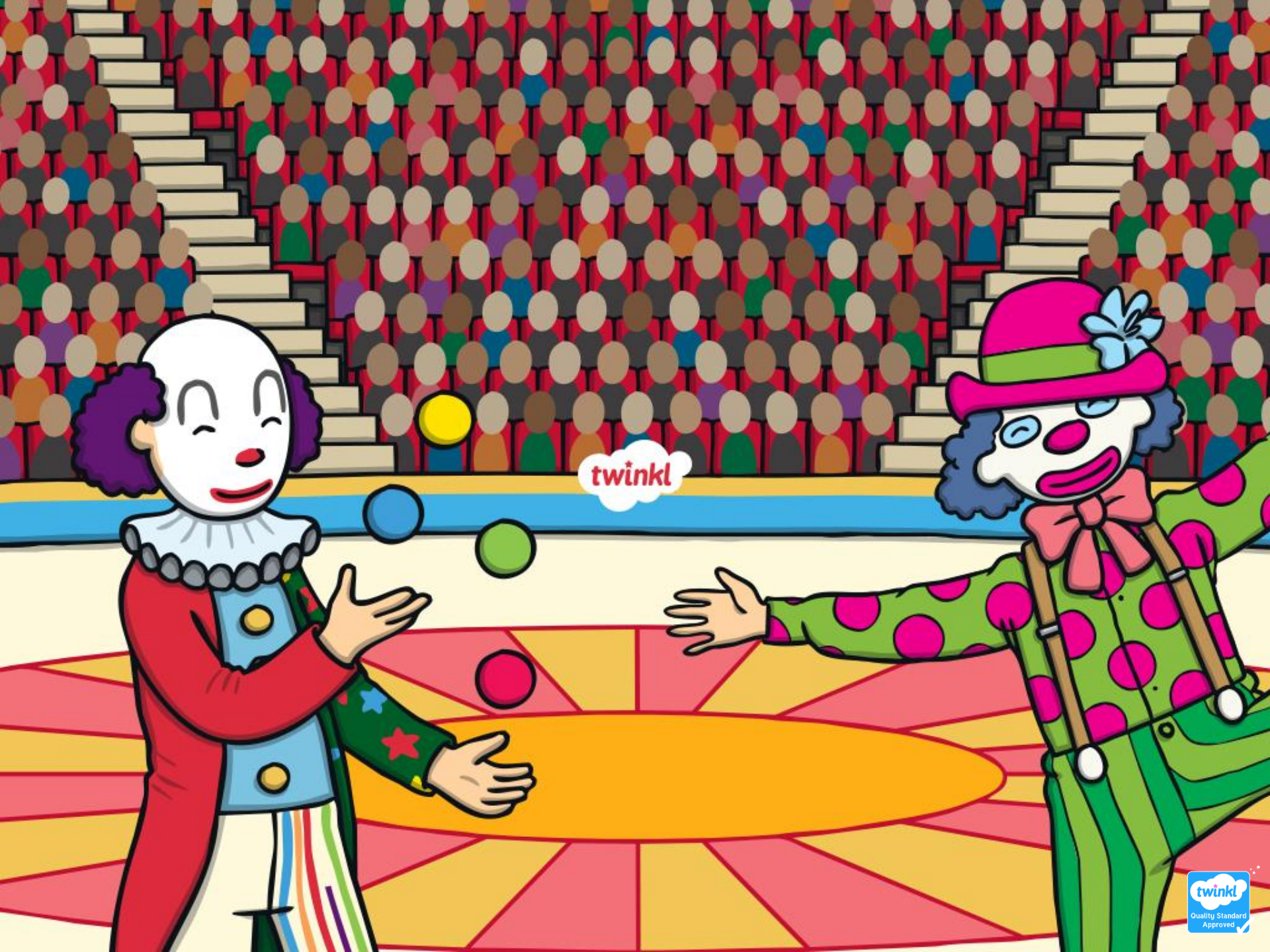
